
Using iPads with your students?

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
Day I - iPad Expectations

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- Walk with my iPad
- *Hold my iPad with two hands (hug it!)
- Keep food and water away from my iPad
- *Only use the app I am supposed to be on
- *Be gentle when tapping the screen
 - *Sit while using my iPad
